From Marx's letter derives the paraphrase, "If that is Marxism, then I am not a Marxist."^[iii]^[35] American Marxist scholar Hal Draper responded to this comment by saying: "There are few thinkers in modern history whose thought has been so badly misrepresented, by Marxists and anti-Marxists alike."^[36] On the other hand, the book *Marx* (ãfžãf«ã, Marx) is a character from the Kirby series, and is the primary antagonist of the Milky Way Wishes subgame in Kirby Super Star.
